Administration and Governance

The Administration and Governance Committee is responsible for:

- Communicating with government and other organizations to participate in legislative and policy issues related to the profession; and
- Effective implementation and administration of legislation and policies.

To achieve these responsibilities, the Administration and Governance Committee maintained the Policy Subcommittee, completed *The Community Planning Profession Administrative Bylaw, 2015*, commented on the Canadian Institute of Planning (CIP) proposed By-Law No. 1, and worked to develop the SPPI Operations Manual and Council Handbook.

Policy Subcommittee

The Policy Subcommittee represents Council at events and on committees, reports back to Council on events and committee meetings attended, and prepares position papers in response to local, regional and provincial planning topics and issues. Members of the Policy

Subcommittee are Francis Wallace, Mauricio Jiménez, Tatsuyuki Setta, Lenore Swyston and Robin Riehl.

Currently, the Policy Subcommittee represents SPPI Council on the Main Street Saskatchewan Advisory Committee.

The Main Street Saskatchewan Advisory Committee provides advice to the Ministry of Parks, Culture and Sport on the planning, implementation and periodic review of the Main Street Saskatchewan program, which is a comprehensive, community-driven program that revitalizes historic downtown commercial areas based on the principles and best practices of community organization, economic restricting, heritage conservation and design, and marketing.

The Community Planning Profession Administrative Bylaw, 2015

The Community Planning Profession Administrative Bylaw, 2015 (Administrative Bylaw) is prepared pursuant to subsection 15(1) of *The Community Planning Profession Act, 2013*. The Administration and Governance Committee began work on this bylaw in October 2013, and emailed a draft to the membership on March 3, 2015, for review and comment. Due to technical difficulties, some members did not receive this email. A second email was sent March 23, 2015, with a deadline of April 24, 2015, for response. After incorporating member comments, Council approved the Administrative Bylaw on June 10, 2015.

In summary, the Administrative Bylaw outlines the following:

- Officers of Council and their duties;
- Nomination and election policies;
- Tenure of office and policies for filling a mid-term vacancy on Council;
- Policies for conducting Council meetings;
- Subcommittees of Council;
- Council representation on external committees and boards, including the Canadian Institute of Planning's Board of Directors, and remuneration and expenses of these representatives;
- Signing authority, execution of documents and SPPI's corporate seal;
- Membership fees and other revenues;
- Sponsorship policies; and
- Financial reviews and audits.

The Administration and Governance Committee thanks all members who submitted comments for the Administrative Bylaw.

The Canadian Institute of Planning Proposed By-Law No. 1

In February 2015, CIP requested comments from SPPI Council and membership regarding the proposed By-Law No. 1. An email was sent to the membership on February 27, 2015, requesting comments by March 27, 2015. After conducting a review of the by-law and incorporating member comments, the Administration and Governance Committee prepared a response letter from SPPI President, Karen Bolton, to CIP President, Michael Gordon. Sent on April 15, 2015, this letter provided comments on:

- Annual financial statements;
- Voting rights of regulated planner membership;
- Quorum for Board of Directors meetings;
- Remuneration of directors and officers; and
- Description of office and vacancy in office for the Board of Directors.

The Administration and Governance Committee thanks all members who submitted comments for CIP's proposed By-Law No. 1.

SPPI Operations Manual and Council Handbook

The SPPI Operations Manual and Council Handbook provides direction to Council on interpreting policies within the Administrative Bylaw and *The Community Planning Profession Regulatory Bylaw, 2013*, as well as guidance on practices outside the scope of these formal documents. The Administration and Governance Committee began work on the Operations Manual and Council Handbook in November 2014, and continues to develop its content.

Some of the topics contained within the Operations Manual and Council Handbook are:

- Detailed roles and responsibilities of Officers of Council and the Executive Director;
- Templates for nomination forms and election ballots;
- Process for chairing a Council or Subcommittee meeting;
- Description of external committees and boards, along with SPPI's representative;
- Evaluation of sponsorship requests;
- Description of SPPI awards and their evaluation criteria;
- Continuous professional learning; and
- Conference planning and communications guides.

The Administration and Governance Committee anticipates completion of the Operations Manual and Council Handbook by the fall of 2015.

Professional Development

This has been an exciting and fast year! The Professional Development Co-Chairs and Committee have continued to work on a variety of initiatives that were identified in the 2013 SPPI Council Strategic Plan.

- Provide professional development opportunities to members

Regional and Urban Planning Program

As part of the continued relationship with the Regional and Urban Planning Program at the University of Saskatchewan, the Regional and Urban Planning Committee undertook a review of the Regional and Urban Planning Program curriculum. This process also included input from faculty and students. The suggested changes include though are not limited to:

- Adding and removing classes to core requirements and specific streams
- Name changes to various streams to better capture what the stream is
- Create Northern and Indigenous, Geo-Spatial, and Regional and Local Development streams

This year the Work Study Program included a total of five (5) hosts and five (5) students placed in fall 2014. In term 2, there were four (4) hosts and seven (7) graduating students placed, three (3) of which were placed with one host. At the end of each term and when the placement is completed, students are required to provide a report about their placement along and both the host and student complete a feedback form.

Thank you once again to the hosts and participants!

The Committee is currently working with the students enrolled in the Regional and Urban Planning Program to find additional ways to bridge the gap between students and employers/school and working in a professional setting. This year, there was a presentation to the students regarding the role of SPPI and members of Council attended the Student Career Fair.

Professional Designation Process

The Committee has been working on streamlining the process for candidate (new provisional) members to submit their logbooks and take oral exams (when necessary) under the former system. The Logbook Committee was provided with a revamped evaluation form to assist the evaluation process while providing consistency to the process. In addition to this, SPPI is working to provide assistance to new candidate members preparing to move to RPP status. This includes investigating mentorship options, creating a fact sheet on PSB for the Council handbook, and others.

Awards

There are a number of awards presented by SPPI each year. The awards sub-committee reviewed and discussed changes to the evaluation criteria. The Awards Sub-Committee also participated in the adjudication for the McLoed Jourdin Award, James Pooler Award, and the Excellence in Planning Award.

Professional Development

In the last year, there have been a number of learning opportunities outside of the annual conference that SPPI was involved in at various levels. Two workshops were held for development appeals and regional planning. The workshops were provided through a collaboration by SPPI and the Provincial Government. Lunch and Learns and Urbanity 101 events were held in Regina. Two events were held in conjunction to World Planning Day.

Regina's Planning in the 21st Century by William Chandler and Saskatoon's Planning For The Common Good by Paul Born.

Others

The Professional Development Committee has completed a number of other deliverables including:

- Identifying potential stakeholders, partners and collaborative relationships

- Preparing a communication piece on the new designations of SPPI for the website, an e-blast to members and information for employers
- Creating a list of volunteer opportunities for SPPI members
- Attending events such as provincial consultation on the Subdivision Regulations

Promotion & Public Relations

Promotion & Public Relations

The goal of the Promotions & Public Relations Committee is to ensure that SPPI is seen as the body of planning excellence in Saskatchewan with professional planning seen as an essential service. Over the past 12 months, the Committee has made significant effort to raise the profile of SPPI through a new website, new name, various communications and building new connections.

Communication

The Committee strongly believes that two-way communication is the key to a successful communication. A bi-annual survey was introduced this year and conducted to ensure Council is continuing to pursue goals that are important to the membership. The website has been instrumental in the execution of communications to the membership, in addition to the email blasts and social media (www.facebook.com/SaskPlanning; www.twitter.com/SaskPlanning). The Committee is exploring opportunities to use LinkedIn to foster additional dialogue among members.

Survey

SPPI conducts two surveys annually: one following the SPPI conference, and one in early spring. This year, we will only be conducting one survey since CIP will be administering the conference survey. This past spring, we asked the membership to answer 10 questions on a variety of topics including: your opinion of SPPI's image within the industry, your satisfaction with member services, your interest in different areas of professional development opportunities and some general demographic information. The purpose of this survey is to ensure the priorities of SPPI Council are aligned with those of the membership. By completing this survey you assist Council with deciding where resources should be focused and provide us with valuable information about our growing membership. This spring, we received 30 responses from our membership and learned the following: Over 75% of those surveyed believed that SPPI's image within your area of practice is positive; nearly 80% of those surveyed would like to see more learning resources available on the SPPI website; there was strong support for all of the learning opportunities presented (workshops, in-person presentations, webinars, and Lunch-and-Learns); and 93% of those surveyed stated that they are satisfied or very satisfied with the member services provided by SPPI. THRIVE 2015 CIP | SPPI Annual Conference

In 2014, SPPI was pleased to be selected as the 2015 CIP Conference host affiliate. Since then, a conference committee of 30 individuals have been working tirelessly to ensure your 2015 conference experience was a memorable one. Four committees composed entirely of volunteers – Sponsorship, Program, Social/Cultural, and Communications – met numerous times over the past year and half planning a conference that would showcase the great planning being conducted in Saskatchewan. Here are some of the highlights: the Sponsorship Committee obtained a record high sponsorship level for CIP; the Program Committee secured 3 keynote speakers, 13 Workshops, 3 Lightning Round Sessions, 15 Learning Tours, 33 Concurrent Sessions,

2014 Design Regina

Fraser-Gatrell Planning Awards

These awards are designed to recognize the efforts of both members and non-members of SPPI as they promote and enhance community planning in our communities.

Distinguished Contribution – Planner

Fraser–Gatrell Memorial Scholarship

The Fraser–Gatrell Memorial Scholarship has been endowed in memory of two Saskatchewan community planners who were tragically killed in northern Saskatchewan in 1993. The late Tom Fraser was the manager of the Provincial Government's Northern Community Planning office. The late Darren Gatrell was an excellent student who graduated from the RUD program in 1992 and had begun his career in the same office.

The '*Fraser–Gatrell Memorial Scholarship Award*' is intended to be funded for fifteen years, through annual earnings of a trust established by donors to be awarded by the University of Saskatchewan. The value of the Scholarship is estimated at \$1,200, based on University practices regarding trust value preservation.

Selection for the award is based on a completed project or paper dealing with planning or development in Canada, north of the 53rd parallel, on overall achievement of the applicants, and on their community involvement. Applicants for the scholarship award may include individual students or groups of students, full-time in RUP, who submit an urban design project or research paper on urban, regional or community planning in Northern Canada.

The Selection Committee, comprised of the Dean of the College of Arts and Science, and representatives from the RUP Administrative Committee and SPPI/CIP, determines the winning candidate. All competition entries must be submitted to the RUP Chair in three copies. RUP does not commit itself to grant the award if no deserving submissions are made in a particular year. The deadline for submissions of entries for the Fraser-Gatrell Memorial Scholarship Award is the last working day February of each academic year.

Volunteer Recognition Award

The purpose of this award is to recognize the efforts of an SPPI member based on a personal commitment to planning; and to recognize extraordinary services and a significant contribution to the Association by a volunteer.
